*Airline Ambassadors* has taken a proactive role to educate airlines and flight crews about this growing phenomenon. We coordinated two Congressional Briefings on the issue, and are working with UNICEF to build and support Safe Houses at every major border crossing in Haiti. American Airlines responded by sending a bulletin to AA flight crews on July 30, 2010, making a commitment to include this issue in 2011 EPT's and highlighted the issue in a September 2011 American Way issue.

We are planning a training at DFW on Monday, January 31, as part of this effort, teaching about the issue and how to be vigilant during the week before the SuperBowl. Thank you to our flight attendant union - APFA has given this huge support featuring the training on their website front page.

The Attorney General of Texas expects 10,000 cases of human trafficking in the DFW area around this event. The Texas based non-profit, Traffick 911 has launched a National **"I'm Not Buying it Campaign"** to bring public awareness to this issue that has been endorsed by a former NFL Pro. Domestic minor sex trafficking is an epidemic in the U. S. and the average life expectancy of a child forced into sexual slavery is just **7 short years**. The scope of this human rights issue is one that needs non-profits, businesses and governments to tackle in a coordinated effort. The Super Bowl captivates our nation and is a unique platform for awareness and education. This is a chance to save the lives of helpless children being brutalized right under our noses and we want to educate as many flight attendants as we can.

"I'm Not Buying It", is a coalition of organizations and public awareness campaign the week before the Super Bowl (2/6/11). Airline Ambassadors is supporting the effort by flying in experts in human trafficking to be part of a 1 week community effort bringing attention to the issue. The effort is being coordinated by Deena Graves of [www.traffick911.com](http://www.traffick911.com) and includes Tina Frundt (founder of Courtney's House). Tina recently won the Frederick Douglas Award and is the feature of upcoming major documentaries on CNN as well as Oprah.




**What You Can Do**

- Be observant of passengers as they check in, board, and fly, especially children and who accompanies them, and young women traveling alone.
- If several of these traits are present, do not confront suspected traffickers or try to rescue suspected victims, rather: **IN AIR:** have pilot contact ICE or ground authorities. **ON GROUND:** Contact TSA, ICE, or call **911** and National Human Trafficking Hotline **888-373-7888**.

**I'm Not Buying It**



**Common Traits of Victims**

- Scripted/inconsistent stories
- Branding or tattoo with "Daddy," a man's name, or money symbols
- Wounds, whip marks, and bruises at various stages of healing
- Frightened, ashamed, or nervous
- Malnourished and/or eats as if ravenously hungry
- No eye contact or watchful to the extent of paranoia
- None or few personal items
- Accompanied by someone far better dressed
- Dressed inappropriately: immodestly or not right for weather
- Unsure of destination or if traveling alone, who will meet them

- Afraid of uniformed security
- Under the control of those they are with: not allowed to speak for themselves, not in possession of own passport, money, or papers, and not free to walk alone, even to stroll through plane or use restroom

**Action Steps**

- If a young woman is traveling alone, ask the reason for her trip. If she has been promised a job, ask the nature of the job and if she knows the person who will be meeting her. False employment promises and modeling jobs are common lures.
- If a child is traveling with someone who does not appear to be his/her parent, ask if you may take the child on a tour of the plane. If the adult refuses to allow it, be suspicious.
