It was incredible to visit Angor Wat at dawn, and to meet Scott Neeson of the [Cambodian Children's Fund](#). Scott, former head of Twentieth Century Fox, dropped everything to move to Cambodia and began supporting children living at the local dump who had no future. He is providing shelter, education, food and medical care to hundreds of children. Sponsorships are \$1200 per year.

In response to Scott's work and the children's need, Airline Ambassadors is initiating sponsorships for 68 children at the Cambodian Children's Fund.
